

Under the SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Act, advanced practice providers (APPs), including nurse practitioners (NP), certified nurse midwives (CNM), clinical nurse specialists (CNS), certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNA), and physician assistants (PAs), can apply for their buprenorphine waiver to treat opioid use disorder (OUD) after completing 24 hours of training.

Here are three options for completing the additional 16-hour portion of the waiver training required for APPs:
